

### Stan Green's Lecture & Trunk Show at SBSQC Meeting August 9<sup>th</sup>

"Color is very important to me," Stan said of his quilt making process. "I'm really drawn to bright colors."

Stan explained a lot of the quilts he makes use hand-dyed fabric with a wide palette of colors to choose from. One of Stan's signature elements of his quilts is that he hand-quilts all of his work in order to achieve a thicker texture in his designs. He also hand-cuts many of the pieces of fabric he incorporates into each design. "I haven't planned out the whole quilt; I start at one section and work it through, then go off from there," he said.

One of Stan's favorite pieces he has completed is a quilt called "Sunrise Sunset" based on the scenery of the straits across from his home in Diamond Point. He explained the colors in the quilt represent water patterns and the vibrant colors that come across the water in the morning and the sunset on the straits in the evening.

Our librarians provided popcorn and a fun display of some of our SBS library DVDs. 40-50 quilters enjoyed their lunch while watching the very first episode of The Quilt Show by Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims. Those that didn't attend will have to watch the show to learn a very creative use for wash away thread. The new projector was able to show the movie on the wall above the posters that belong to the Masons.



### Education News Flash...

Education has some great news. Sandra Foster has offered to teach another 101 Beginners Quilting class this fall. Check around you. Some of our best quilters have taken this class from Sandra.

She would like to offer a 7 week class with an intro in August. (total 8 weeks) This would take students through Oct 18th to finish a 9 block wall-hanging. On business meeting day, there would be half day class. The class would be just piecing, and not the full spectrum of quilting. Students would accomplish the beginners piecing and then can move on to intermediate piecing.

Beginner piecing is cutting, how to achieve an accurate 1/4" seams, straight piecing, working with bias, curved, set in piecing, and perhaps reverse shapes. Borders, Binding, and sashing well be covered as well. Sandra likes to work one-on-one with her students so class will be limited to 6 students.

The cost would be \$100 for this 8 weeks. That works down to \$6.50 per class. This would cover her cost of printing and extras needed for class. We will start signups the meeting after the quilt show July 26<sup>th</sup>.

In January she will be teaching a more extensive 20 block class that she feels will give any new quilter the skills of an intermediate quilter.

We have also been asked when we would have another "Lunch & Movie" so we are glad to announce plans for this event on Aug 23<sup>rd</sup>. We have been looking at months with 5 Wednesdays & having the movies on the 4<sup>th</sup> one if it is free.
