NOURISH

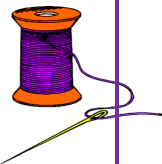
Feed your sense of humor to manage difficult times.

QUILT CHALLENGE 2018

Beginning at the June Business Meeting, June 13th, the Quilt Challenge Team will be accepting your challenge quilts (in paper bags for Secrecy). We will continue to accept your Challenge Quilts on June 20th, June 27th, and on the final deadline of July 11th. This will give the team enough time to display the quilts at the July 18th meeting for Voting. Turn in your quilts to one of the Challenge Team members, Judy Ramos, Martha Scott and Pat Payton. We will identify ourselves with a sign where we sit at meetings. Along with your quilt in a paper bag, please submit a short explanation (on a small index card if possible) of why you chose the book you did. Please add a hanging sleeve. You will receive a number that will identify your quilt to the team and the membership.

Voting is on July 18th at the SBSQC meeting. The First, Second and Third place winners will have ribbons on them at the Quilt Show.

- Use the title of a book for your project title.
- You can use children's books or any book you have read.
- It is your interpretation of that book, title, or some content of that book.
- Use at least 5 fabrics. • Use at least 2 flying geese.
- The quilt cannot be smaller than 100 sq. inches.
- The quilt cannot be larger than 600 sq. inches. Submitted by Judy Ramos

The following three organizations received quilts at the June business meeting for their upcoming fundraising events.

Michelle Ostroot, representing Habitat for Humanity, received a striking red and black bar quilt for the The Cedars at Dungeness Wine Festival to be held on Saturday, July 7 at 3 p.m. Sales of raffle tickets sold for this quilt will go to help Habitat for Humanity build a new home for a local family in need.

Steve Sahnou, VP of the Sequim Valley Lions Club was on hand to accept their quilt for the 8th annual Crab Feed that will be held at Pioneer Park on Saturday, June 30 from 2-6 p.m. This salmon themed quilt was made by Eleanor Geiger and quilted by Marilyn Williams. The Sequim Valley Lions Club continues to raise funds to help those in the local community with vision or hearing problems who are unable to financially help themselves.

Vern Frykholm of the George Washington Society received a patriotic quilt made by Carol Prael and Cindy Smith. Joyce Duarte's quilting of shooting stars (think 4th of July) carried out the theme. The George Washington Society sponsors the Northwest Colonial Festival at the George Washington Inn that will be held August 9th-12th. Raffle tickets for this quilt will be sold at the Lavender Festival in July and at the Colonial Festival in August. Daily reenactments and history education programs will be presented daily. As a side note, Vern Frykholm is our landlord at the storage unit for Community Quilts. We are most appreciative of his support for our club.

Quilting Notion of the Month by Marcylyn Kleinberg

This month's quilting notion is the Galaxy Electric Seam Ripper. This 4 inch long battery operated tool uses one AA battery. It will help you easily and quickly undo sewing mistakes. Arvilla McAlister told me several years ago about the seam ripper and I like it so well that I have two, one at home and the other in my travel sewing supplies.

To use the seam ripper, place the seam that needs fixing on a surface in front of you. Slide the seam ripper between the layers of fabric. The blade will not damage your quilt.

The Galaxy seam ripper can be purchased on line. I found it on Etsy for \$16.95-17.95, and Amazon for \$16.38. There is also a short you tube video on how to use it.
