Sue's at Sequim's 'Things to Do' event

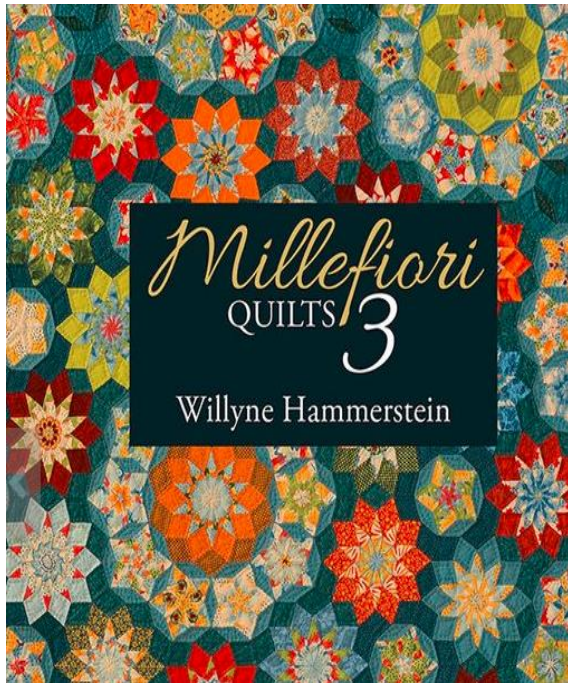
