

June 13, 2018 General Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 A.M. Board members in attendance were Deb Cooper, Martha Scott, Janet Lenfant, Barbara McArthur, and Murph Gerber.

Geneva Coffin, a Lifetime member of SBSQC, was present and could only stay for a short time. She wanted to express her thanks to all who had remembered her with cards and get well wishes as well as prayers for her recovery.

Community quilts made 3 separate presentations of quilts to Habitat for Humanity, Sequim Valley Lyons Club, and George Washington Society.

The minutes of the last meeting were distributed and approved. The treasurer's report was given by Martha Scott. She also announced that a purchase of a computer was made at the cost of \$491.03 which includes a 3 year warranty. She also announced that the club was delaying the purchase of Quick Books for 2019, as Seri Mylchreest had loaded her own personal version on the computer for use during the rest of 2018. Martha told us she had purchased a new Ipad as a gift to the club. Thanks to both Seri and Martha.

Deb Cooper made the announcement that our mission as a club is education and the promotion of quilting for the benefit of all members. She stated that the Board has approved changes to the Standing Rules, Section 1: Education classes #1 and Section 1: Education classes #4. These changes will be discussed and voted upon at the July General Meeting.

The vice President's report was given by Janet Lenfant and Barb McArthur. They announced that the next Kamp Sew-A lot will be 4 days, October 22-25, 2018. Also, it will be 4 days, May 20-23, 2019.

Committee chairs gave their announcements;

Mary Ann Clayton told us ticket sales are going well for the Raffle Quilt.

Brianne Moores asked people to volunteer to hang sheets on Wednesday, before the show, and reminded us to have a label and sleeve on any quilts entered in the show.

Sandra Foster, education, told us they are taking names and money for tacos for Sue Sew Day, June 20th. She reminded us that there will not be a Sew Sue day in July due to the Quilt Show.

Loretta Watkins and Doris Hartness are the "Lounge Ladies". They asked volunteers to sign up for food for the Quilt Show in the highlighted spots on the sign up sheet.

Loretta Bilow told us the joy quilts will be wrapped and prepared for distribution by anyone wanting to help. Those volunteers are to meet at her house at 10A.M., on June 18, 2018. She also read a thank you from the Humane Society.

Cindy Smith read a thank you note from Serenity House for 25 quilts donated to them from Community Quilts.

Gail Van Horsen told us she still needs people for the Quilt Turning at the Quilt show. People who volunteered their vintage quilts for the show are to bring them to Gail at any of the next few meetings.

Judy Anderson told us she still needs small quilts for hallway decorations. After the show they will become "Joy Quilts"

Janet Green said she will be selling passes to the Quilt show for family members of SBSQC members.
