

July 11, 2018 General Meeting Minutes

Board members attending were: Deb Cooper, Janet Lenfant, Barbara McArthur, Martha Scott, Pat Paynton and Murph Gerber.

Community Quilts made two presentations of quilts. The Sequim Community Aid and the Lavender Growers Association were each presented with a quilt which they may raffle for fundraising. The Sequim Lavender Growers reminded the club that they will be located at Carrie Blake Park for this year, and perhaps again in the future.

Martha Scott gave the treasurer's report. \$37,195.57 is the Net Worth of the club. \$16,401.05 is in money market, the CD has \$12,032.05 and the checking account has \$4,794.91.

The proposed changes to the Standing Rules for Section I, Education Classes, Article I, was read by Murph Gerber, who also made the motion to adopt these changes: Seconded by Judy Ramos. Several members of the club, who elected to speak, were allowed to do so for either Yah or Nay by lining up on the appropriate side of the room. After the individuals were timed with a limit of one minute each to say what they felt, a vote was called for. The Yah vote was 21, the Nay vote was 36. There were only a few who abstained from voting. The Motion for change was defeated.

The second Standing Rule Changes to Section I, Education Classes, Article 4 was read by Murph Gerber and a motion was made by Murph Gerber to accept the changes. It was again seconded by Judy Ramos. The same timed format was followed by anyone wishing to speak regarding this issue. Discussions and opinions were numerous. After

the discussions, a vote was called for again, by a show of hands raised. The vote was Yah, 22; the Nay was 37, with 17 abstaining. The motion was again defeated.

Sherry Nagel presented a Motion to form an Education Steering Committee which was seconded by Sue Nylander. Sandy Foster and Diane Davis both spoke to the club. A vote by show of hands was called with 68 Yah, 2 Nay, and 8 abstaining. The motion passed.

The Vice Presidents report was given by Janet Lanfant and Barbara McArthur. Janet reminded those people attending the retreat scheduled for August 20-23, that their final payment is due by August 1st. Kamp-Sew-A lot, October 22-25, will have sign ups at the August General Meeting. Those on the waiting list for Kamp last May, may sign up if they are interested in attending in October. They have first chance for the October Kamp.

Doris Hartness and Loretta Watkins thanked everyone for signing up and contributing food and water for the show. They asked that we bring smaller trays to aid in refrigeration. And please list the ingredients on a 3x5 inch card for the food you prepare.

Sherry Nagel thanked us since all positions had now been filled for the country store.

Janet Green is in charge of the Welcome area.

Sharon Clayton reminded us that she wants all large quilts (K,Q,F) that are to be sold in the country store, to be turned in Wednesday, July 18. The people selling items in the country store are to bring all of their tubs, clearly marked with their names on both lids and tubs, to the country store on Thursday morning at 10:00.

"Sunshine" was presented by Helga Barton. She gave several gifts to lucky people when their number was called. She announced the cake bakers as well.

Show and Tell was two lovely quilts made from old redwork done by her family members over a long period of time. Lovingly hand quilted!
