OCTOBER MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Three proposed bylaws or Standing Rules amendments were discussed and voted upon:

1. Article X: Distribution of Assets
*If the Club becomes a non-viable entity (i.e. disbands), any and all assets including monies in checking, savings and/or Certificate of Deposits will be distributed by the Board to another 501(c)(3) organization(s) that meet the Internal Revenue Service's exempt purposes requirements. Members may provide names of organizations to the Board for consideration. **PASSED***
2. To correct an ambiguity in when a late fee would be assessed, Article III Section 3 changed to state: *If the annual dues are not paid by January 31, a late fee will be added to the dues. **PASSED***
3. Standing Rules, Section VI, sentence 6 changed to state, " ...At present, annual dues are \$50..." **PASSED**

SUNBONNET SUE'S NEXT ZOOM MEETING


The Sue's Have Gone Virtual! Last month we had about 40 folks attending. We would love to see more of you "in person" this month.


TREASURER: SERI MYLCHREEST

TIPS

- ❖ Preload needles before beginning a quilting session by sliding several needles onto the wire of a needle threader, inserting the thread through the threader and pulling the needles down the thread on the spool. When you need a threaded needle, just cut off the appropriate length of thread with one needle on it, leaving the rest of the needles hanging on the spool.
- ❖ One easy way to organize your stash is to take your fabric like it comes off the bolt folded and use your ruler (mine is 5 X 24) you roll your fabric around your ruler until it is all 5" wide, then you slide out your ruler and fold it in half length wise and you have a perfect stackable fabric, no matter how many yards you have of it. Then your fabric can sit on the shelf and you can see what you have!!
