
## ANN SHAW CLASS

Ann Shaw gave a presentation to the whole club on Wednesday, June 22, on her work and how and why her process is different. That afternoon she did a mini-demonstration on her technique. We were having technical difficulties and she was so gracious! It was her first group virtual class along with us, so we all needed to learn what needed to be adjusted to make it work. Unlike in-person classes, electronic phones and computers can create feedback and static. We had a great class both in the material covered and the class participants. Everyone was thrilled to be working together, and we even had a class member attending while in rehab! We used both classrooms in A Stitch In Time - the first day in the smaller one and the larger room on Day Two.

This hybrid of both Zoom and in-person classes may be the look of the future. It enabled more people to join and saved the club travel expenses for the teacher.

# FIBER ART REUNION

Community Quilt members were asked by SBSQC club member Claudia Berry's daughter to empty her sewing room. She and her husband had removed everything they wanted. We accomplished that on May 14.

As we went through the sewing room donations, we came across an old weaving. There were two notes with it. One said "Ewart Family Tradition says this Coverlet was woven prior to the War of 1812. This was given to my aunt by a member of the Ewart Family. Property of Mary Margaret Kidd." The second note repeated itself but went on to say "From the Family of Robert L. Ewart (husband of Maude Smith Ewart) Family tradition says this coverlet was woven prior to the War of 1812. Panels separated in order to be used as partiers. This information via Auntie Maude."



It became clear that we needed to try to return this valuable coverlet to its family and I volunteered to work on that.

My ancestry search knowledge is limited so I contacted a friend, Jackie Jardine-Moore, on May 24th and gave her the story and she set to work to discover the connections so we could return the coverlet. With the limited information Jackie was given it only took her one day to locate Paula Yount in Florissant, Missouri. Paula, her 92-year-old mother and Paula's daughter stated that they were honored to become caretakers and preserve the coverlet.

By May 27th these are the connections Jackie found: Mary Margaret Kidd's father's name was Claude (close to Claudia). Claudia Kidd was the daughter of Mary Margaret Kidd and niece to Maude Ewart. Claudia Kidd married Don Berry and thus became the Claudia Berry we know. Thus, Mary Margaret Kidd is Claudia's mother. Maude Ewart is Claudia's aunt.

I mailed the coverlet to Paula Yount on May 28, 2021. Paula is the daughter of Sarah Amanda Ewart and the niece of Robert L. Ewart. Robert and Sarah would have been the grandchildren of the woman we presume probably did the weaving. Her name was Annabel Braden Ewart.

The coverlet arrived in Missouri on June 2, 2021, and Paula planned to drive the 3-hour trip to show her mother and her sister.

I hope you enjoyed this story as much as I enjoyed being part of the mystery.



## JOY QUILTS






