EDUCATION


EDUCATE, CREATE, DONATE

There she taught techniques of using the walking foot for quilting all or parts of a quilt. She stressed the importance of completing work as opposed to perfection.





Quilters, we have an abundance of nearly completed quilts that need binding. Let us know if you can help.

JOY QUILTS



We are down to 14 joy quilts, so we need to get the message out. We need mostly 18" to 20" quilts. We are doing okay with animals.

The quilts do not need to be pieced if the fabric has lots of items on it, or animals, etc. Just make a block with four large squares, (front and back) and then bind them. Easy Peasy!

The Fire Department in Sequim is now getting them and I will be meeting with someone in the Police Department. I know they have nothing in their cars now, as one small child that had to be taken did not receive anything. We must get these in their cars.

Thank you all for always helping get the quilts we need!

MYSTERY QUILT CLUE 4

I hope you are enjoying the journey! This month you will be making lots of strip sets, then subcutting. Only one more clue before the reveal – so hang in there!

Inspector Clue Sew

It's a Mystery!

Clue #4

Step J

Select the following strips:

- 1 strip 8" (5 ½") x WOF Background
- 1 ½ strips 6 ½" (4 ½") x WOF Background
- 2 strips 5" (3 ½") x WOF Background
- 2 strips 3 ½" (2 ½") x WOF Background
- 2 strips 2" (1 ½") x WOF Background
- 5 ½ strips 2" (1 ½") x WOF Focus
- 10 strips 2" (1 ½") x WOF Accent



These stripsets require 40" of useable fabric. Different fabrics will probably have different lengths. Make sure to align fabric strips at one end, and make the squaring-up trim as small as possible to get the largest amount of useable fabric.

To make Stripset A, sew the 8" (5 ½") strip of **Background** to a 2" (1 ½") strip of **Accent**. Then sew a 2" (1 ½") strip of **Focus** to the **Accent**. Press all seams toward the **Accent** fabric. Subcut into 20 2" (1 ½") rows.

To make Stripset B, sew the 6 ½" (4 ½") strips of **Background** to a 2" (1 ½") strip of **Accent**. Then sew a 2" (1 ½") strip of **Focus** to the **Accent**. Sew another 2" (1 ½") strip of **Accent** to the **Focus**. Repeat this with a ½ strip length of **Background** and **Focus** and a strip cut in half of the **Accent**. This makes 1 ½ lengths of Stripset B. Press all seams toward the **Accent** fabric. Subcut into 30 2" (1 ½") rows.

To make Stripset C, sew the 5" (3 ½") strip of **Background** to a 2" (1 ½") strip of **Accent**. Then sew a 2" (1 ½") strip of **Focus** to the **Accent**. Sew another 2" (1 ½") strip of **Accent** to the **Focus**. Finally, sew a 2" (1 ½") strip of **Background** to the **Accent**. Repeat with remaining strip to make two stripsets. Press all seams toward the **Accent** fabric. Subcut into 40 2" (1 ½") rows.

To make Stripset D, sew the 3 ½" (2 ½") strips of **Background** to a 2" (1 ½") strip of **Accent**. Then sew a 2" (1 ½") strip of **Focus** to the **Accent**. Sew another 2" (1 ½") strip of **Accent** to the **Focus**. Finally, sew a 3 ½" (2 ½") strip of **Background** to the **Accent**. Press all seams toward the **Accent** fabric. Subcut into 20 2" (1 ½") rows.

RAGGEDY PLAID

Help sew up blocks for Raggedy Plaid quilts to be sold at the boutique. You will be given fabric and instructions to make as many blocks as you would like. We will be using yarn-dyed, mostly homespun-type plaids in a really easy, raw-edge machine applique technique. You will need to bring a machine that will do zigzag and a medium-dark neutral thread as well as the usual sewing supplies and equipment. Chris McDonald will give the demo and put the blocks together and do the quilting. This is a cuddly, back-of-the-sofa guy-quilt that will appeal to non-quilters who will never realize how easy it was to make. Instructions are on the website.
