



Sixteen participants prepared boards prior to August 17th and were ready to go for the Zoom/video workshop with Suzi Parron, author of *Following the Barn Quilt Trail*. While we worked independently, some worked in small groups and we were still able to share the experience even though some of us had Covid. Many of the boards have been hung on our homes or garages while others are still works in progress.

We have a full schedule of events coming in the fall and some input is needed for two of the events. Krista Moser of The Quilted Life will provide an afternoon trunk show open to all members at the lodge on October 5th. On the following day there will be a workshop with a selected pattern for 20 to 30 participants. Cost per participant is \$55 plus supplies. Another special event open to all members is scheduled for October 19th. Carin Brimley is a Quiltworx Certified Instructor coming to us from Duvall, WA. She will be sharing her Judy Niemeyer techniques for foundation paper piecing and will need two volunteers to assist in displaying quilts. Carin will return on November 2nd for a workshop offered at the lodge for 10 to 20 participants for \$50 each. Input for project selection is also needed for this class. Participants will need to purchase the pattern or the pattern/kit combo in addition to the registration fee.

Also in November, Ilse Osier will teach Beginning Free Motion Quilting. It is open to a maximum of 10 participants for \$20 and is offered at the lodge on November 16th from 10 to 3.





One of the newer books in the library is Modern Quilt Magic by Victoria Findlay Smith. The sub-title is "5 Parlor Tricks to Expand Your Piecing Skills." She covers two types of partial seams, "made fabric", the dreaded Y seam, and curves. These are all techniques that any quilter would like to add to their skill set, but explained well so that newer quilters can succeed. There are small practice pieces that would be perfect Joy Quilt size (hint, hint) as well as larger projects. No magician's hat is needed for these tricks, just a few bits of fabric and an adventurous spirit. It is book 1242 in our Piecing section.
