

## STRAIGHT SHOOTER 38" x 49"

This makes a nice masculine quilt. Consider using batiks, blues, neutrals or earthy colors.

Fabric requirements:

Twenty-five arrows -

For each arrow, cut one 6" square and two 3 1/4" squares.

Use either a variety of available fabrics, five fat quarters or 25 layer cakes.

Background - 1 1/2 yards

Cut nine 3 1/4" strips x WoF for the arrows

Sub cut into 25 3 1/4" x 6" units and 50 3 1/4" squares

Cut six 2 1/2" strips for the vertical sashes

Cut two 3 1/2" strips for the top and bottom borders

Binding - 1/4 yard

Backing - 1 1/2 yards

Each arrow finishes 5 1/2" x 8 1/4"

For each arrow, diagonally stitch a small arrow square onto a 3 1/4" x 6" background unit.

Trim and press open.

Repeat on second corner.

(this is the same as a flying geese unit.)

In the same manner, sew two background squares onto one side of a 6" arrow square.

Join the two units to make one arrow block.

Square up to 6" x 8 3/4".

Arrange the 25 arrows into five columns of five each, alternating row directions.

Attach the six sashes between the columns.

Add the top and bottom borders.
